Redmen rebound from sluggish start, enter second semester in overdrive

The Redmen opened their 133rd season with a sluggish 0-4-1 start but head coach **Martin Raymond** - in his 14th campaign behind the bench -- found a way to right the ship and the Redmen rebounded with a solid 7-2-0 clip heading into the December exam break.

The team's biggest question mark is who will win the starting job between the pipes after the graduation of All-Canadian **Mathieu Poitras** and **Jean-Michel Filiatrault**, the OUA's top goaltending tandem for the past three years. Three freshmen -- **Danny Mireault**, **Hubert Morin** and **Kevin Defosses** -- are all battling for the starting role along with **Jake Jarvis**, a senior from Toronto.

Mireault, a 6-foot-1, 191-pound native of Notre Dame des Prairies, Que., started for Joliette in the Quebec Jr. AAA league last year after previously serving as a back-up

in the QMJHL with Rouyn-Noranda and the Quebec Remparts.

Morin, who measures 5-foot-9 and 169 pounds, hails from St. Georges de Beauce, Que., and played for the St. Lawrence Lions, a collegiate prep

program that competes in the Quebec Jr. AAA league.

Defosses joined the Redmen in December after stints in the QMJHL (Quebec) and the IHL (Port Huron). The 5-foot-11, 175-pounder could be a dark horse down the stretch.

The Redmen have good size but a new look behind the blueline with the graduation of three veterans who accounted for a combined 11 of the 18 goals scored by McGill rearguards last year. Heading that list of defencemen lost is captain **David Urquhart** (21GP : 4-12-16), an All-Canadian and four-time all-star who turned pro with the Hartford Wolf Pack, becoming the fifth McGill player in the past decade to play for an AHL team. Also gone is offensive-minded **Louis-Simon Allaire** (28 GP: 5-12-17) and steady veteran **Steven Pearce**, who was hampered by a knee injury the past two years.

Meet the 2008-09 Redmen Captains: Eric L'Italien and Ken Morin

Veterans **Eric L'Italien** and **Ken Morin** have been named co-captains of the McGill men's hockey team.

It marks the first time that the Redmen have had co-captains since the 1986-87 season, when **Mike Babcock** and **Mark Reade** shared the captaincy.

L'Italien is a speedy 6-foot, 197-pound right winger from Ste. Foy, Que. The fifth-year senior is currently in his second year of law school after graduating with a bachelor of arts degree in psychology in 2007.

He has scored 44 goals and 99 points with 136 penalty minutes in 152 career contests



with McGill. He joined the Redmen in 2004 after four seasons in the QMJHL with Rouyn-Noranda Huskies (1999-2003), the Quebec Remparts (2003-04) and the Rimouski Oceanic (2004-05).

Morin is a 6-foot, 190-pound rearguard, from St. Prosper, Que., who celebrated his 24th birthday in October. The fourth-year



industrial relations major owns a 10-45-55 record with 199 penalty minutes in 122 games. He joined the Redmen in 2005 from the Grand Prairie Storm of the Alberta Junior Hockey league.

Head coach **Martin Raymond** is also continuing his recent tradition of using a system of rotating alternate captains throughout the season.

The players picked for that honour include seniors **Sam Bloom** of Toronto, **Yan Turcotte** of Laval, Que., **Erik Stilling** of Calgary and junior **Benoit Arseneault** of Rimouski, Que.

Key returnees include **Yan Turcotte** (26 GP: 3-4-7), a rugged 5-foot-11, 213-pound senior who racked up 111 penalty minutes last year. Also back is co-captain **Ken Morin**, a 6-foot, 190-pound defensive-minded senior from St. Prosper, Que., along with big **Ben Gazdic**, a 6-foot-1, 230-pound junior from Toronto, who possesses a booming shot from the blueline and **Erik Stilling**, a 6-foot-4, 215-pound senior from Calgary who missed 24 league games last season with a shoulder injury.

The prized newcomer is **Marc-André Dorion**, a 5-foot-11, 184-pounder from St. Hubert, Que., who earned QMJHL all-star status for Baie Comeau last year and was invited to the 2008 rookie camp of the NHL's Dallas Stars. In 62 games with the Drakkar last season, he scored 16 goals and tallied 59 points, to go along with 54 penalty minutes. Another QMJHL recruit is **Stephen Valente** (5'7", 191), a Montrealer who skated with Drummondville and Quebec. Also in the mix are Toronto natives **Andrew Wright** (6'2", 166) and **Ben Morse** (5'11", 188). Wright had an impressive 17-31-48 record in 47 contests with the OPJHL's North York Rangers, while Morse had a breakout year with the OPJHL's St. Michael's Buzzers last season, posting a 5-38-43 record in 41 games.

Up front, McGill will have to replace five veterans who combined to score 35.2 per cent of the team's offence (43 of 122 goals). Gone is scoring leader **Shawn Shewchuk** (9-26-35), plus **Simon Courcelles** (16-14-30) and **Guillaume Demers** (11-13-24), in addition to **Mathieu Leclerc** and PK specialist **Chris Churchill-Smith**, who is playing pro in Serbia.

Among the top two lines of returnees is senior **Sam Bloom** (25 GP: 7-18-25) of Toronto, co-captain **Eric L'Italien** (21 GP: 7-16-23), a speedy senior from Ste. Foy, Que., sophomore **Guillaume Doucet** (9-9-18) of Montreal and junior **Benoit Arsenault** (7-7-14) of Rimouski, Que., who suffered an eye injury in the 2008 pre-season and his availability is unknown for the rest of the year.

Another key returnee is **Simon Marcotte-Legaré** (6'1", 194) a sophomore from Longueuil, Que., who is expected to pick up the scoring slack. Among the freshmen is **Alexandre Picard-Hooper** (5'9", 185) of Boucherville, Que., who tallied 137 goals and 323 points in 265 career QMJHL games with Baie Comeau and Saint John and leads the Redmen in scoring. Another key recruit is **Marc-André Daneau** (6'0", 193) from Aston Junction, Que., who had 40 goals and 90 points in 265 contests with Lewiston of the QMJHL.

Another project in the works is the production of 25 large-sized championship banners, in recognition of the 25 league titles won by the Redmen over the past century.

McGill grad scores on first AHL shift



Defenceman **David Urquhart**, who captained the Redmen to the Queen's Cup championship last spring, scored on his first shift in the American Hockey League, sparking the Hartford Wolf Pack to a 3-1 victory over Albany on Nov. 3.

Urquhart, an emergency call up from Charlotte of the East Coast Hockey League earlier in the day, took a pass from Artem Anisimov in the left circle, skated in untouched and rifled a shot past goaltender Daniel Manzato only 28 seconds into the game for his first pro goal after having earned five assists in seven games with the ECHL's Checkers.

"That was a pretty nifty shot under the crossbar," said Ken Gernander, head coach of the Wolf Pack. "And I thought he moved the puck well. He snapped his passes as opposed to just pushing them. In training camp we saw his skating ability, but I think the jump (from McGill University) was so great that he just needed a little time to assimilate himself to the pace of pro hockey."

It is uncertain as to how long the 6-foot, 190-pound Urquhart, a 23-year-old native of Thorold, Ont., will stay put with Hartford, the top farm team of the New York Rangers, as he was called up to replace an injured player.

Urquhart graduated from McGill last spring with a management degree and had planned on returning to study law when Hartford offered him a contract over the summer. He is one of two McGill grads currently in the AHL, joining Mathieu Darche, who spent most of last season in the NHL with Tampa Bay, and captained the Redmen in 1999-00. Darche currently has five points in eight games with the Portland Pirates, the top affiliate of the Buffalo Sabres.

Over the last quarter-century, McGill, known more for its academic reputation, has produced 44 players for the pro hockey ranks, including five who have skated in the AHL and one in the NHL (see list elsewhere in this newsletter).

Coach's Corner with Martin Raymond

Dear Friends,

First, I would like to thank all who generously give or have given, financially or through volunteering their time, to the cause of our Friends of McGill Hockey. With the help of FMH, we are able to provide our athletes on the Redmen Hockey team meals and extra rooms on the road, sticks and skates needed above and beyond the budget provided by the Dept. of Athletics & Recreation. Also, FMH support allows us to offer financial awards to help recruit the top student-athletes as well as help to subsidize our much-needed support staff.



Last year was a good one for the Redmen. We got hot at the right time, heading into playoffs, and kept it going long enough to capture the coveted Queen's Cup -- for the first time since 1946 -- in front of more than 1,000 hostile fans in St. Catharines, Ont.

Our championship team featured the blossoming of many veterans in their graduating year, and the coaching staff was pleased that our group of seniors had the opportunity to taste a championship

before their studies ended. Winning also gave team captain **David Urquart** an opportunity to sign his first pro contract with the N.Y. Rangers organization, signing a one-way deal with their AHL affiliate in Hartford, after a great showing at their summer development camp.

The 2007-08 Redmen also had the fortune of taking part of an overseas tour of Serbia and Hungary. With the assistance of **Marko Kovacevic's** father and **Ron Perowne's** son (Fred), we received an invitation to play hockey in the Balkans. There, former Redmen **Dan Jacob** and **Murray Cobb**, both playing pro in Serbia, were also great hosts, and the tour was an eye-opener. We enjoyed the strong competition, the warmth of the local communities and the time together improving our knowledge of European history. The team also offered hockey clinics to minor hockey players from both Serbia and Hungary, and everyone involved appreciated this experience thoroughly.

As for FMH, they have been as active as ever, holding many events to help our team: Fundraising at the President's Cup golf tourney in Ile Bizard, with the help of **Charles Gauthier** and **Eric L'Italien**. Also, our FMH Banquet was a huge success, with more than 100 people showing up to celebrate our Queen's Cup title at Molson's. Our annual Golf Tournament, held at the private course in Ile-Perrot and spearheaded by **P-A Paquet** and **Van Truong**, also generated significant revenues for FMH. Most recently, **Paul Theriault** and **P-A Paquet** ran a very enjoyable and successful FMH Homecoming Weekend, with many former Redmen showing support.

And thanks to **David Grenier**, the Redmen Hockey School added one week to its program, allowing over 200 youths from Montreal's South Shore to learn the fundamentals of hockey with current and former Redmen players in August. We plan to expand the hockey school to other parts of the city next summer.

The Dept. of Athletics & Recreation has also been a big booster in many ways. In addition to their existing support, the Department recently agreed to include in our budget a provision for the team bus to travel to Ontario a day early for our long road trips. This allows FMH, which previously subsidized such travel, the flexibility to spend funds on other worthwhile projects.

I am grateful, as head coach, to see the commitment and effort put forth by everyone associated with the team, to improve our program and make us one of the premier teams in the country. Yet, I remind everyone that the quest for excellence is never over, and we keep striving to out-do our competition for us to have a chance to become the best in Canada. 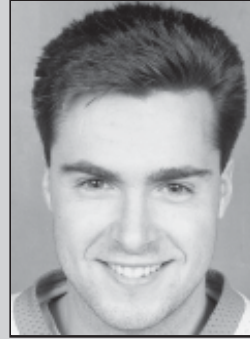

McGill Sports Hall of Fame

Two members of the Redmen hockey family -- **Tim Iannone** and **Herb English** -- headlined a new cast of seven inductees to the McGill Sports Hall of Fame in October.

Iannone, a 42-year-old native of Regina, Sask., is a two-time all-Canadian centre who won league MVP honours and graduated in 1990 as the Redmen hockey team's all-time leading scorer.



Recruited out of the WHL's Regina Pats, Iannone was named Quebec university hockey rookie of the year in 1986-87 and was voted as the nation's most sportsmanlike player that same season.

During his sophomore campaign, the 5-foot-9, 170-pound centre became the first player in Canadian university hockey to score 50 goals in a season, accomplishing that feat with a 52-39-91 mark in 38 contests overall, establishing single-season McGill records for goals and points. He later served as McGill team captain in 1989-90, earned all-conference honours three times and played on Canada's gold-medal winning team at the 1987 Spengler Cup tournament in Davos, Switzerland. At the time of his graduation with an economics degree in 1990, he held 45 McGill hockey records. Today, he still owns over 30 records and he remains as the team's all-time leader in goals (136) and points (267), which he accomplished in 136 career games overall.

English, 76, was offered a contract by the Montreal Canadiens after playing on the 1950 Junior Canadiens team that won the Memorial Cup. He was also a star football player and in 1955, was drafted by the Montreal Alouettes. In his senior year, he won the football team's Fred Wagle trophy as most sportsmanlike player and the Forbes trophy as McGill athlete of the year. English holds the rare distinction of serving as captain of both the football and hockey teams in 1954-55. He was a centre in hockey and played both ways in football as a running back and defensive back. English, who now resides in La Tuque, Que., was previously inducted into the Loyola Sports Hall of Fame in 1969.

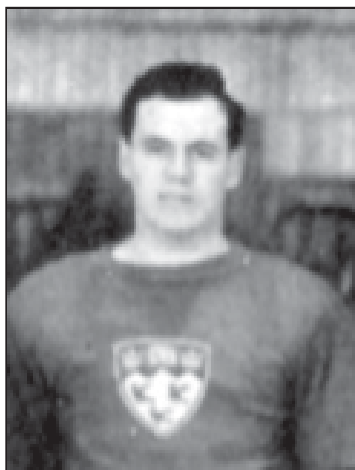
The pantheon now has 90 honoured members named since opening in 1996. Among the Hall's inductees with ties to the Redmen hockey program are 21 former hockey players, two builders and three Redmen teams.

The nomination deadline for next year's induction is March 31. The Hall of Fame luncheon officially kicks off the University's Homecoming Week celebrations and is usually held at the McGill Sports Centre on Pine Avenue.

In Memoriam: Tim Dunn & Rocky Robillard



Tim Dunn, one of the oldest surviving hockey players who skated for the McGill Redmen, died at Ste Anne de Bellevue Veterans Hospital on Nov. 17. He was 89.

A talented athlete who became a Quebec junior champion in tennis, and an outstanding badminton player, Dunn played three seasons of varsity hockey for McGill, from 1937 to 1940, and was scouted by the Toronto Maple Leafs as a candidate to play in the NHL.

He helped the Redmen win Queen's Cup league championships in each of his

first two campaigns with the club. Both years, the Redmen also captured back-to-back titles in the International Intercollegiate Ice Hockey League, which included Ivy League teams such as Yale, Princeton and Harvard.

Born Timothy Hibbard Dunn in Quebec City on Aug. 26, 1919, he was educated at Quebec high school, then Lakefield College School in Lakefield, Ont., before entering McGill in 1936.

Dunn, who played on the junior varsity hockey team during his freshman year, was also an honoured member of both the Scarlet Key Society and the Martlet Society.

When the Second World War broke out, he enlisted in the navy, serving with distinction as a lieutenant on the corvette 'Chilliwack.' Dunn later returned to McGill and graduated with a commerce degree in 1944.

He made a lifelong commitment to McGill and remained true to his belief in the gift of education. In the early 1990s, Dunn and the surviving members of the 1938 McGill football and hockey championship teams, created the 1938 Champions Awards, presented in memory of their teammates who lost their lives in the war. These awards are offered to current student-athletes on the basis of academic performance and qualities of leadership demonstrated.

In 2002, the Tim Dunn Award was initiated as an annual "athletic scholarship" for a member of the hockey team who has demonstrated leadership on an intercollegiate team while maintaining high academic standing.

He is survived by his sister Mary Dunn and his six siblings (Peter, Stuart, Robert, Brian, Debra, Daryl), plus 15 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

A private service was held in Montreal. In lieu of flowers, the family has suggested a donation to any charity in his name.

Rock Robillard, a former hockey and football star at McGill, who went on to coach the hockey Redmen died in Ottawa on Oct. 27. He was 86.

A sports broadcaster with CFRA and CJOH and play-by-play announcer with the Ottawa Rough Riders, "Rocky" had the rare distinction of captaining both the McGill hockey and football teams in the same year. After graduation, he became a full-time staff member at McGill, serving seven years as an assistant football coach (under the Doug Kerr and Vic Obeck regimes), while serving as head

coach of the hockey Redmen from 1951 to 1958, guiding the team to a 54-64-5 record overall.

Born Rock Anthony Robillard on Aug. 28, 1922 in Ottawa, he was educated at Lisgar Collegiate and St. Pat's College.

A member of No. 429 Squadron, he served with the army and air force from 1942 to 1945 and flew numerous missions in the Avro Lancaster, a four-engine, heavy bomber, which was arguably the most famous and successful night bomber used during the Second World War.

A gifted athlete and humble recipient of many athletic awards, Robillard entered McGill in 1947, where he also competed on the intermediate track and basketball teams, before graduating with a science degree (physical education) in 1950.

After stepping down from his coaching duties at McGill, Robillard moved back to his hometown to embark on a teaching and administrative career at the University of Ottawa, St. Patrick's and Fisher Park schools, Ridgemont and Highland Park high schools.

Under his grad photo in the 1950 Old McGill yearbook, was one of his favourite expressions: "It's not the size of the dog in the fight. It's the size of the fight in the dog."

He is survived by five siblings (Joan, Henry, Betty, Matthew, Laurie), three daughters (Wendy, Patty, Nancy), six grandchildren, two great-grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

A memorial service was held Nov. 8, at Holy Redeemer Church in Kanata, Ont. Interment at Norway Bay United Cemetery was scheduled to take place at a later date.
