New mentor Nobes has relentless Redmen in gear

With 11 former members of the Redmen currently making their living coaching a high level of hockey, the McGill program continues to be a breeding ground for great coaches. Four grads are currently coaching in the NHL and newly-named McGill head coach **Kelly Nobes** is the next up-and-coming young mind to carve his niche as bench boss of the Red and White.

Nobes, a 36-year-old native of West Hill, Ont., becomes the 28th head coach in team history and the 11th former Redmen player to guide the squad. He replaced **Jim Webster**, who had filled in for **Martin Raymond** on an interim basis and led McGill to an impressive 34-14-1 record overall and the Queen's Cup title as champions of the Ontario University Athletics conference.

Now at the mid-way mark in his maiden voyage behind the McGill bench, Nobes and his coaching staff have guided the Redmen to an impressive 21-0-2 start that includes a 16-0-2 record in league play at the mid-term break, only six victories shy of setting a single-season school record.

Nobes, who skated for the Redmen from 1993 to 1997 and served as an assistant coach to **Martin Raymond** from 1999 to 2001, brings nine years of head coaching experience under his belt, including stints at both RMC

and Laurier, where he led both teams to single-season school records for wins. In four years at Laurier, he posted an impressive 77-34-1 regular-season mark (.692), guiding the Golden Hawks to the second-highest win total of all 19 teams in the OUA during that span and also a berth at the CIS championships in 2007.

Voss is boss... Saskatchewan native named team captain

Leadership has been an integral part of the Redmen hockey team's success. Head coach **Kelly Nobes** is aware how unique the leadership group is within the Redmen locker room. After watching the team gel during the preseason, Nobes named a new set of captains for the 2010-11 campaign.

Evan Vossen of Swift Current, Sask., is the team captain for McGill's 135th season of hockey and also the centennial anniversary of the Queen's Cup since the CIS hockey league was founded in 1902.



Vossen is the first Saskatchewan native to take over the captaincy since 1986-87, when **Mike Babcock** of Saskatoon shared the duties with **Mark Reade**.

Vossen, a six-foot, 195-pound hard-nosed left-winger, joined the Redmen in 2007 out of the La Ronge Ice Wolves of the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League.

Heading into the Christmas break, he has a 36-29-65 record with 56 penalty minutes in 91 regular-season career games with the Redmen.

Vossen can count on the experience of alternate captains **Marc-Andre Dorion**, a physical education junior, and **Guillaume Doucet**, a physical education senior, to maintain "tous une equipe".

"It's a big honour to be named captain of this team – one that has such a rich hockey history," said Vossen, a 24-year-old industrial relations senior, who noted that winning two Queen's Cup championship and qualifying for Nationals four times in the past five seasons has unified the team towards a common goal.

"That experience has put all the returning guys on the same page for reaching our goal."

The "centennial captains" will play an important role in passing on good habits to the younger student-athletes who will be the team's leaders in the coming years.

Five Redmen invited to CIS hockey training camp for World University Games in Turkey

Five members of the McGill Redmen are among 31 hockey players from the Ontario University Athletics conference that have been invited by Western Ontario head coach **Clarke Singer** to a CIS training camp in preparation for the 24th Winter Universiade in Erzurum, Turkey next month. The event, also known as the World University Winter Games, will run from January 23 to February 6.

The camp is scheduled for London, Ont., Dec. 9-14, with practices slated for Thompson Arena and Western Fair, along with an exhibition game in Toronto against Canada's national world junior team Dec. 14 at the MasterCard Centre.

McGill, the No.3-ranked team in the nation, has the second-highest number of players invited, behind the No.4-ranked Western Mustangs, who lead the way with seven players.

Four goalies, 11 defencemen and 16 forwards are in the mix, headlined by McGill's **Francis Verreault-Paul**, the OUA's player of the year and a BLG award nominee last season. The native of Mashteuiatsch, Que., is a third-year science student who currently leads the CIS with 22 goals and 33 points in 14 games.

Joining him in training camp are McGill teammates **Evan Vossen**, a senior forward out of Swift Current, Sask., centre **Maxime Langelier-Parent** of Boucherville, Que., goaltender **Hubert Morin** of St-Georges-de-Beauce, Que., and blueliner **Marc-Andre Dorion** of St-Hubert, Que., who was named as the CIS most outstanding defenceman last year.

McGill grads steal spotlight at Habs home opener

Tampa Bay coaches **Guy Boucher** and **Martin Raymond**, both McGill graduates, stole the spotlight at the Montreal Canadiens home opener at the Bell Centre, Oct. 13, 2010. They guided the Lightning to a 4-3 come-from-behind win in overtime.

Trailing 3-2 with less than two minutes to play, Tampa Bay roared back to tie the game at 3-3 on a goal by Steven Stamkos at 18:41. Ryan Malone then tallied the game-winner at 4:09 of overtime.

Boucher, the head coach who played for the McGill Redmen from 1991 to 1995 wasn't wearing his McGill tie. Raymond, who played for McGill from 1987 to 1992, then coached the Redmen for 15 years, was wearing his favourite cravate.

"I knew Marty was going to be wearing his red tie, so I decided to save mine for when we go up against Detroit and (McGill grad) **Mike Babcock**," said Boucher, half-joking and half-serious.

"I could lie to you, but I have to admit it's pretty special," said Boucher, who was raised in the Montreal suburb of Roxboro and played his minor hockey in the city. "This is a team I watched my whole life, this is my home.

I can't pretend like it's not special, because it was."

The post-game lineup to chat with **Guy Boucher** [BA '95, BSc (AgrEng), '96] and **Martin Raymond** (BEd '90, MEd '96) featured one of the largest gatherings of Redmen alumni outside of a Homecoming event. Among those crowded around was **Jean Pronovost**, the former NHL star and Redmen coach who gave Boucher his first opportunity to coach in the QMJHL.

Other former Redmen on hand included Friends of McGill Hockey president **Mike Nelson**, Dr. **Jay McMullan**, **Dave Gourde**, Dr. **Skip Kerner**, **David Grenier**, **Alain Cusson**, **Matt Humes**, **Mathieu Boisvert**, **Ben Vadnais**, **Chris Churchill-Smith** and **Teddy Kyres**, plus current Habs player **Mathieu Darche** and Habs staffer **Ken Morin**.

Grads go head-to-head in NHL match-up at Bell Centre

MONTREAL -- They came, they saw, they didn't conquer. The Los Angeles Kings were beaten 4-1 by the Montreal Canadiens at the Bell Centre, Nov. 24. For a McGill fan, it was a tough night to cheer as McGill grads were on both benches of this National Hockey League encounter.

In the Habs lineup was **Mathieu Darche**, a 2000 management graduate from St. Laurent, Que., who assisted on the game's first goal and was also on the ice for his team's last goal. Darche is the 10th McGill player to skate in the NHL.

On the Los Angeles bench was **Jamie Kompon**, a 1989 physical education grad from Thunder Bay, Ont., who is in his fifth season as an assistant coach with the Kings after nine years with the St. Louis Blues. Kompon is the sixth former Redmen player to coach in the NHL.

The dueling duo is part of a McGill family of quintuplets, all of them former team captains with the Redmen, currently in the NHL, and believed to be the highest total of grads from any single university in Canada or the United States in the NHL at the same time.

Others include Detroit Red Wings head coach **Mike Babcock** and the Tampa tandem of head coach **Guy Boucher** and assistant coach **Martin Raymond**.

Two other former McGill players have coached in the NHL -- **George Burnett** (Edmonton, 1994-95; Anaheim, 1999-01) and **Lester Patrick** (New York Rangers, 1926-28).

When watching the world junior hockey championships over the holidays, look for former Redmen All-Canadian **George Burnett** on the Team Canada coaching staff... George, who coached Cape Breton to the AHL's Calder Cup championship and went on to coaching stints in the NHL with Edmonton and Anaheim, is currently coach and GM of the OHL's Belleville Bulls...

Had a blast this past summer at the **Mike Babcock Day** in Saskatoon, celebrating his Olympic gold medal with a lot of laughs (and a few libations) with **Mark Reade**, **Marek (Muff) Nesvadba** and Babs, of course... Reader recently moved to Winnipeg from Atlanta (talk about climate change) and taken a new position as executive VP with Imris, a global leader in image-guided therapy solutions...

Stephane Marcoux was in Montreal recently, visiting from Columbia, where he has been running an inline roller hockey program for 12 years. He served as head

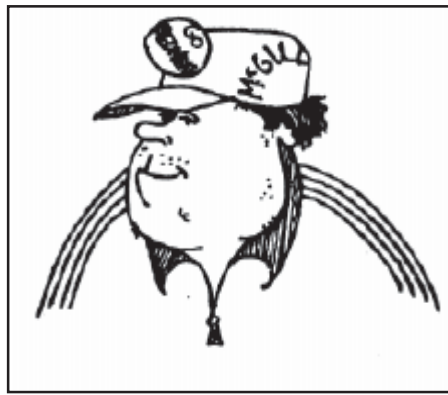


Illustration of Pearl by ex-Redmen captain Ken Covo

IN MEMORIAM: Warren Chippindale (1928-2010)

Warren Chippindale, a generous and long-time supporter of the McGill Redmen, who skated for the team from 1947 to 1949, passed away on Nov. 27, 2010 in Montreal.

He was born March 22, 1928 in Denver, Colorado and moved to Montreal in 1933 at the age of five, where he became a naturalized Canadian under his father's British citizenship. As a young man, he was an avid student-athlete and attended Iona Avenue School, Roslyn Elementary School and Westmount High School before entering McGill University in 1945.

He joined the Phi Delta Theta Fraternity where he made many lifelong friends. As a senior varsity hockey player he enjoyed two successful seasons with McGill in addition to his junior career with Verdun.

He graduated from McGill with a B.Com (Honours Economics) and went on to become a chartered accountant. He joined McDonald Currie & Co (later to become Coopers & Lybrand) in 1949. He was appointed chairman and chief executive partner in 1971 - serving in that capacity, as well as international chairman, until his retirement in 1986.

From 1986 to 2000, he served as a director of a number of leading public companies including Alcan, Bell Canada,

BCE, BCE Mobile, BCE Development, The Molson Companies, Canadian Investment Fund, The Laurentian Group, The Harris Bank and Spectrum Financial Services.

More recently, he was the advisor to the chairman and president and CEO of the Salk Institute for Biological Research from 2000 to 2007.

Over his lifetime, he received a number of honours including The Order of Canada in 1997, an Award of Merit (Gold Medal) from The McGill Graduates Society in 1988, an honorary degree (LLD) from McGill in 1995, and a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Montreal Neurological Institute in 2004.

He is survived by his wife Joan (nee Macadam), children Linda, Debra, Nancy, Alan and John, in addition to 12 grandchildren, two stepchildren and five step-grandchildren.

A special Memorial service for colleagues and friends is scheduled for May 7, 2011 in Montreal.

Frankie goes to Hollywood?

Redmen sniper **Francis Verreault-Paul** continues to score at a torrid pace and by season's end, could either be the subject of a Hollywood movie or better yet, receive an offer from a pro team.

The 5-foot-10, 180-pound forward from the Innu community of Mashteuiatsh, Que., was second in the CIS scoring race last year when he was named league MVP and earned All-Canadian honours.



This year, the science junior leads the nation in goals (26) and points (39) in 16 games. He has already surpassed the goal-scoring leader in the country for all of last season and is now chasing the OUA regular-season record for most goals, shared by McGill's **Tim Iannone**, and Laurentian's **Denis Castonguay**, both of whom scored 35 in 25 games during the 1987-88 campaign. It will be a challenging task for Verreault-Paul as he has already missed two games and is expected to miss at least three more contests next month while playing for Canada at the World University Games. His high-octane production was a large factor in the Redmen registering 18 consecutive victories to start the year, breaking a 74-year old school record for most consecutive wins, dating back to 1936-37.

NHL team keep tabs on prospect

Marc-Andre Dorion is off to a blazing start in his third year at McGill, leading all CIS defencemen with a 7-25-32 record in 18 games heading into the second semester.

The 5-foot-11, 185 pound rearguard from St. Hubert, Que., also led the nation last year, when he registered 36 points in 25 regular season games, was named the nation's most outstanding defencemen and merited



All-Canadian honours.

A former QMJHL all-star with the Quebec Remparts, who quarterbacks a potent Redmen power-play unit, he has drawn attention from a few NHL teams.

After attending the Dallas Stars prospects training camp in his freshman season at McGill, Dorion received invites to the Toronto Maple Leafs prospects camp last July and was invited back for their rookie camp in September.

Despite all this interest from the pros, Dorion will continue to hone his skills in a McGill uniform this season as part of a very strong defensive unit. His pro experience has proven beneficial as Dorion is playing with great confidence and has emerged as a leader on the Redmen back end.
