## No.2-ranked Redmen front-runners in OUA at the halfway mark

Last spring, McGill came up one win short of being able to lay claim to the unofficial title of "Canada's hockey school." But with the defending national champion Martlets still ranked No.1 in the country, and the national finalist Redmen once again rated second among the men, the University might get another shot at a national title sweep in the spring.

Going into the holiday break, just beyond the season's halfway mark, not much has changed for McGill's hockey team this season – not in terms of on-ice results anyway. The two-time defending Ontario University Athletics champ Redmen lead their conference with a 13-1-2 mark, a point better than second-place UQTR over whom they hold three games in hand.

Head coach **Kelly Nobes**, meanwhile, wouldn't have minded if this year's team resembled the 2010-11 squad a little more.

"We had a really interesting first half because of the number of injuries that we had, and it really challenged our team and forced us to play with different line combinations and different defence pairings," Nobes said. "It forced us to juggle things around, but it also allowed some of the younger players, the first- and second-year guys, to get more of an opportunity than they might normally have had. And for the long-term that's great for the program."

While the team's typical stellar defensive play has been as good as ever this year (averaging 2.29 goals against per game; third-best in the nation), the injuries are being felt most in the scoring department and McGill is only ranked 15th in the nation in goals scored, thanks to the early season loss of eight veterans, resulting in 64-man games lost in the first semester.

First-line centre **Alexandre Picard-Hooper**, the CIS player of the year last season, went down with an upper body injury and has missed eight games, while linemate **Francis Verreault-Paul**, the nation's leading goal-scorer in each of the past two years, has

missed four games. Senior winger **Marc-Andre Daneau**, felled by a preseason knee injury, has yet to play this year, and third-year forward **Patrick Belzile** (mononeucleosis) is in the same boat. Also sidelined have been defencemen **Hubert Genest** and **Ryan McKiernan**, each of whom have sat out 10 games with various ailments.

"We found ways to stay at the top of the league and won our games in a lot of different ways," said Nobes.

Picking up the slack for the fallen D-men have been freshmen **Nicholas Therrien**, a solid two-way defender who was at the St.

## Redmen grad to receive military decoration from Governor General

Maj. **Derek Prohar**, a former McGill football and hockey player from Avonlea, Sask., is among 44 soldiers who will be awarded a Meritorious Service Medal. The announcement was made by **David Johnston**, the governor general of Canada, last week.

It is the second military decoration for Prohar, who previously received the Medal of Military Valour in 2007, after working as a liaison officer with the United States Special Forces in Afghanistan



during the battle at Sperwan Ghar, September 5-12, 2006.

Prohar was a defensive back with the McGill Redmen football team for one season, then joined the hockey Redmen, where he played at forward and patrolled the blueline from 1994 to 1998. He won the University's Richard Pound Award in 1998 for proficiency and leadership in athletics before graduating with a bachelor's degree, majoring in economics and political science.

Prohar was an Operational Mentor and Liaison Team operations officer and headquarters company commander in

Afghanistan. He planned and influenced operations, guaranteeing the necessary support to mentor teams operating in isolated and high-threat locations.

In 2006, he held the rank of captain and was working as the rear machine gunner on the battalion commander's vehicle when wounded by an improvised explosive device during an intense enemy ambush and despite his injuries. He continued returning fire and assisted the commander with the control of the attack, which resulted in the successful seizing of key terrain.

The recipients will be invited to receive their decorations at a ceremony to be held at a later date. Canada's military valour decorations include, in descending order of rank, the Victoria Cross, the Star of Military Valour and the Medal of Military Valour.

## "Voss" is boss of McGill longevity record

**Evan Vossen**, captain of the Redmen in history as McGill's, makes me feel very honoured. There is a great deal of pride that comes with putting the McGill jersey on, not only for myself but for anyone else that has ever worn it, and I feel very fortunate that I have stayed healthy and been given the opportunity by my coaches to do it for as many times as I have already."



The six-foot, 190-pound left winger from Swift Current, Sask., became the school's all-time leader in games played when McGill edged Queen's 3-2 in Kingston on Nov. 11. He surpassed the team record of 187, held since 1986, when blueliner **Paul Barber** finished his five-year career with the Red and White. The mark was equaled in 2010 by **Yan Turcotte**, also a rearguard.

"When I first came to McGill I didn't really expect to hold any records," said Vossen, a fifth-year industrial relations major. "To be able to hold that record with a hockey program that has been as successful and rich

Louis Blues training camp in September, and **Hugo Laporte**, an offensive-minded blueliner and a veteran of five QMJHL seasons with Gatineau and Baie-Comeau.

Freshman centre **Marc-Olivier Vachon**, who captained the Voltigeurs de Drummondville for three of his five seasons in the "Q," has done an admirable job of filling in for Picard-Hooper, Nobes noted.

"He's a great two-way forward who's done time on the power play, kills penalties and is a good faceoff man too."

The Redmen have also seen a bit of a change between the pipes, where freshman **Mark Segal** has emerged to split the duties with veteran **Hubert Morin**.

Segal, who toiled for the Vancouver Giants of the WHL the past two seasons, has a goals-against average of 2.53 with a 6-1 record.

Morin is second among league-leaders with a 2.08 goals-against average, to go along with a .918 save percentage and a 7-2 record.

"It's a bit of a balancing act," Nobes said.

"The rookie has to play to get better but the fourth-year man does too to stay sharp. But we're comfortable with either guy in the net at this point."

Leading the team in scoring at the break is senior **Marc-Andre Dorion**, the CIS defenceman of the year two seasons ago, who currently leads the nation with 21 assists, to go along with four goals in 16 contests.

Dorion, who has had NHL tryouts with Dallas, Toronto and Phoenix, has recently established school records for most assists (134) and points (168) in a career by a blueliner, breaking the standards set by **Martin Routhier** (108 assists from 1993 to 1998) and **Gilles Hudon** (152 points; 1980-84), respectively. Dorion, who could return for a fifth season, needs 12 more goals to break Hudon's all-time mark for rearguards (45 goals).

The Redmen will host Waterloo in a pair of exhibition games at McConnell Arena Dec. 29-30 before resuming their regular season schedule at home Jan. 6-7 when they host Ottawa and Ryerson, respectively.

## Redmen play before second largest Montreal college crowd since 1968

**Ryan McKiernan**, a defenceman from White Plains, N.Y., scored the game-winner when McGill closed out the first semester with a 3-2 victory over the Royal Military College Paladins, before 3,780 in men's hockey at the Verdun Auditorium in a rare morning game on Dec. 2.

The event was part of a successful "Score with School" promotion by **Martin Routhier's** company "Rooths Sports Events" that drew 68 busloads of students from 15 elementary and high schools from the Lester B. Pearson and English Montreal school boards. It marked the second-largest crowd since 1968 to see a university hockey game in Montreal and the biggest since Oct. 21, 2007 when 5,406 watched McGill defeat Concordia for the Ronald Corey Cup at the Bell Centre.

## Burnett collects 500th win in OHL coaching ranks

**George Burnett**, a McGill graduate who was the first member of the hockey Redmen to earn all-Canadian honours, earned his 500th career victory as a head coach in the Ontario Hockey League, Dec. 2.

A 49-year-old native of Port Perry, Ont., Burnett reached his milestone victory as coach and general manager of the Belleville Bulls and in an 8-1 rout over the Kingston Frontenacs.

Burnett skated for the Redmen from 1982 to 1984 and set a McGill single-season record (since broken) with 81 points in 38 games overall during his freshman campaign.

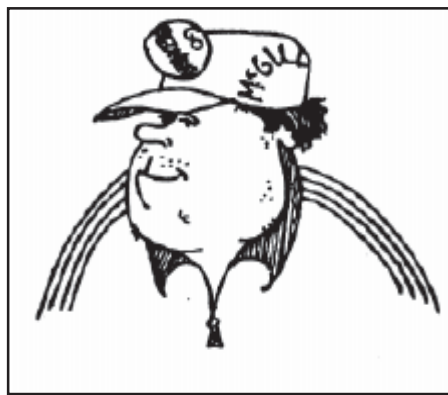
